We are sincerely grateful for our friends in Birmingham and around the nation who stepped in to help – from actual cash donations, to food, and diapers.

However, in this darkest hour, we began to see jobless folks come to us for help with opening businesses. Our Affinity Group Lending members prioritized making their loan payments – 100% of the loans were repaid. Students remained engaged in our College Access Program. The perseverance we witnessed reaffirmed the determination of our constituents to reach their dreams and aspirations.

I have never been more proud to work with my teammates. They are the real hero's. Each program rapidly reorganized their service delivery models when we left abruptly on March 18, 2020. We helped file taxes and complete immigration applications in a drive through setting. 


